

ANNUAL REPORT OF THE *Trustees*

2022/2023



The Manchester Airport Community Trust Fund celebrated its 25th Anniversary in December, and since inception in 1997 has donated over £3.9m.

In celebration of the 25th Anniversary year a special CTF Eco Garden competition for primary schools was launched with **£40,000** of funding available for primary schools in the CTF area of impact to promote environmental awareness for young people and create eco gardens for future generations.

The winning schools were:

- **Cheadle Catholic Infant & Junior School** (Stockport) - £25K
- **Newall Green Primary School** (Manchester) - £10K
- **Brooklands Primary School** (Trafford) - £5K

We partnered with Gardena, a garden supply company, as event sponsor who added over **£20,000** worth of garden supplies and advice to all schools that applied.



ABOUT THE TRUST

The Trust benefits an area of approximately 10 miles from the Airport and offers grants of up to **£3,000** to community groups and charities looking for tangible items of long standing value. The Trust is permanently open and has four meetings a year.

Applications are considered by six Trustees who are drawn from the Manchester Airport Consultative Committee to represent the City/Borough Council areas within the boundary, along with an Airport representative.



Tameside Armed Services received **£1502.70** to provide basic solar electricity for allotment buildings.

This year we were pleased to welcome Rachel Akilli as the second Airport Trustee.

WHERE THE MONEY COMES FROM?

The Community Trust Fund's income is an annual **£100,000** donation from Manchester Airports Group and noise fines imposed on the airlines of departing aircraft that breach noise levels.

Noise fines FY 22-23

During the year the Airport's passenger and flight numbers have returned to almost pre pandemic levels, and there have been 17 departing aircraft who have exceeded permitted noise limits resulting in fines totalling **£12,902.40**. This income is directed back to the Community Trust Fund.

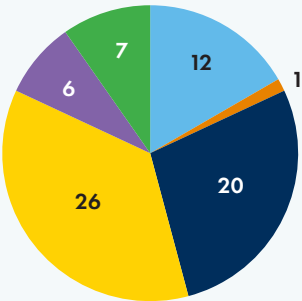
HOW HAS THE MONEY BEEN SPENT?

The Trustees met in April, July and October 2022 and January 2023 to consider applications made

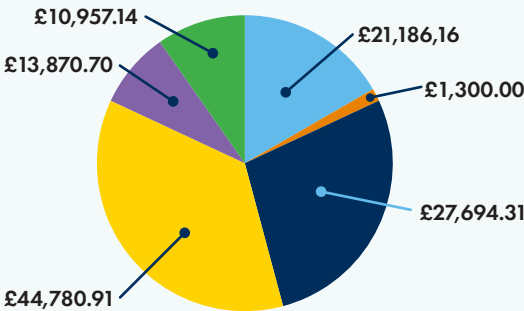
In 2022/2023 72 grants have been awarded, amounting to **£119,789.22**

£40K has also been ringfenced for winners of our Eco Garden competition, a one off celebration for our 25th Anniversary

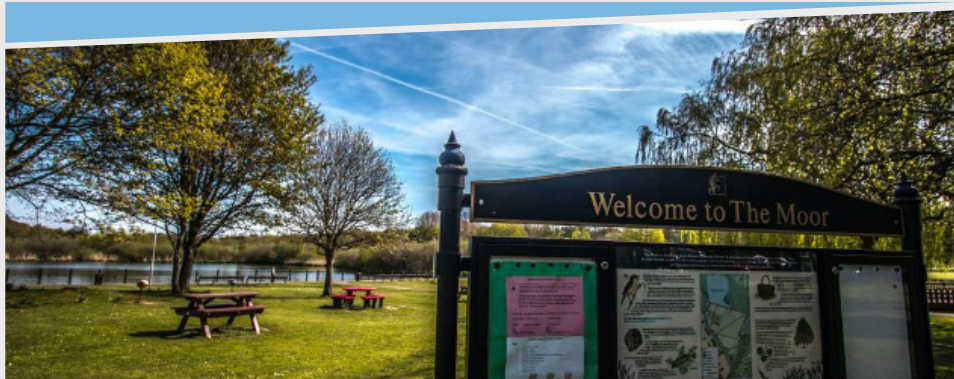
Total Number of Grants 22-23
