

## Roadworks on the M56

National Highways are currently upgrading the M56 between junctions 6 and 8 to provide more capacity on the road.

If you're travelling to Manchester Airport, please remember:

- We will occasionally need to close the motorway and slip roads overnight to complete work safely. Closures will be between 9pm and 6am the following morning. This will extend to 7am at weekends.
- Plan your journey in advance and check traffic conditions before you set off. For real time traffic information please visit Traffic England at: www.trafficengland.com
- There will be a 50mph speed limit on the motorway.

- If your car has been parked at the airport for a long period of time, please make sure you carry out the simple vehicle checks shown on the back of this leaflet.

# Safety checks







Tyre tread It is a legal requirement that each of your tyres has a minimum tread depth of 1.6mm.





Tyre pressure Driving with underinflated or overinflated tyres can adversely affect your braking distance, steering, fuel efficiency and lifetime of your tyres.





Always keep your tank at least one quarter full to avoid running out on your journey. This will help you avoid breaking down on a busy road or motorway, and potentially putting yourself and others at risk.



Maintaining the correct oil level is essential to prevent your engine from seizing up and breaking down.





### Screen wash

To ensure you have good visibility, always keep your screen wash topped up so you can clear any debris or dirt off your windscreen.





Your lights are not only essential for you; they are also essential for other drivers to understand how you intend to manoeuvre.
