The Airport Community Network relaunched its popular 'Dragons' Den' enterprise competition for secondary schools this Autumn, challenging teams to design a gift they could sell in the run-up to Christmas to raise funds for local charities.

In October, teams of students pitched their business ideas to a panel of 'Dragons', hoping to secure an investment of £200 to get their business started. They then had two months to produce and sell as many gifts as possible, with profits going to one of six local charities. In December, the teams attended a grand final event at 'The Nest' at the Timpsons' head office in Wythenshawe to present their results to the Dragons. Prizes

were awarded for Best Presentation, Most Innovative Product and Best Eco-Credentials, with Priestnall High School being crowned overall winners by raising a staggering £7,800 for Royal Manchester Children's Hospital selling handmade Christmas tree ornaments featuring a tribute to the late Queen Elizabeth II. James Timpson, CEO of one of our biggest local businesses, shared his top-tips for running a successful business including why it's so important to have a happy workforce. Local start-up 'Wiggles Pizza' provided a delicious lunch and also shared the story of how they turned their lockdown hobby into a business. In total £13,335 was raised for local charities.
