AIRPORT ACADEMY GRADUATES CLEARED FOR TAKE OFF

In April, a group of 51 local jobseekers became the first to graduate from Manchester Airport's new Airport Academy programme.

Delivered in partnership with Trafford & Stockport College Group, the free two-week course offers an immersive introduction to careers in aviation. It's designed to support those who are long-term unemployed, lack qualifications, or have faced barriers to stable employment.

We're proud to share that all 51 graduates have now secured roles with employers including MAG, Jet2. com, dnata, Skytanking and ABM.

After graduating, Sadiqa was offered two jobs and is now working at Skytanking as a Customer Service Agent, where she works on the check in desks. She said "This course offered key steps in building my career in the aviation industry. It provided me with an in-depth knowledge of airport operations and industry standards. I would defiantly recommend the course to others.

NEW ACCESS POINT ON MANCHESTER AIRPORT TRAIL IS THE WHEEL DEAL FOR LOCAL CYCLISTS

Located on Old Altrincham Road, the new access point connects to the Airport Orbital Route along an existing wider and flatter tarmac airport perimeter path.

It will improve the existing Airport Orbital Cycleway and allow for sustainable commuting on two wheels for airport staff travelling from the west of the airport.

Visitors will be able to take in airfield views, including aircraft taking off and landing, and explore surrounding areas like Styal Village and Quarry Bank Mill. It will also link to a route which allows users to cycle through the tunnels which lie beneath the airport runway.
