AEROZONE END OF YEAR ROUND-UP

AeroZone

In summer, we celebrated the end of a busy and successful year at our interactive, education 'Aerozone'.

This academic year (Sept 22 – July 23) we are proud that our education programmes, including AeroZone, have supported 7,369 young people. We've also celebrated the AeroZone's first birthday, introduced 'MAG Technology' and 'Girls in STEM' specialist days, reintroduced our specialist work with local colleges and launched the 'Little Book of Travel Tales' for children travelling though our terminals.

Our education programmes and AeroZone inspires young people daily.

However, this wouldn't be possible without our colleagues, who have volunteered to support our programmes throughout the year – mainly as guest speakers in AeroZone. Across the academic year over 150 colleagues have supported our education programmes!

The AeroZone is fully booked from September 2023 – July 2024 and we are expecting approximately 3,000 students to visit. We also have plans to add further activities in AeroZone, including a passport control role play area, a customer service centre and a fire station, which will bring even more airport jobs to life!



188 STUDENTS ENGAGE WITH THE AIRPORT ACADEMY

This year our colleagues at the Airport Academy have been working hard to provide training and skills to local people looking to start a career at the airport.

761 students have been referred to us since January, with 188 engaging in our training courses so far. 96 of those have been successful in gaining roles on the airport site.

We still have a pipeline of activities and events planned, and a series of jobs fairs for Manchester residents to access employment opportunities at the airport. We offer upskilling training for employers onsite to support staff with training gaps. We were

also excited to launch our Level 3 Aviation Ground Specialist apprenticeship, with our first cohort joining us in October 2023.



YOUNG PEOPLE CELEBRATE GRADUATING FROM THE AIRPORT'S SUPPORTED INTERNSHIP PROGRAMME

The Airport's Supported Internship programme, run by Pure Innovations and the Manchester College in partnership with Manchester Airport Group (MAG), lasts a year, during which interns are supported to do three different placements around the airport.

Now they will go on to the world of work with some taking on roles here at the airport.

Six neurodiverse young people celebrated graduating from Manchester Airport's Supported Internships programme in June 2023.

It gives young people who ordinarily might find it difficult to get employment the opportunity to get on-the-job training in a supported environment, with help on-hand during the placements and when applying for work at the end of it.

RETURNING TO OUR USUAL OPERATIONS

The number of aircraft operations in 2020 and 2021 was significantly affected by the pandemic with reduced numbers of passengers flying through our airports. During 2023, passenger operations have shown a recovery towards pre pandemic levels, compared to 2020 and 2021 levels.

Due to the reduced operations during the pandemic, we also closed Runway 2, operating on a single runway. Dual runway operations were gradually phased back into use from April 2022. The operating hours of this phased return was published on our website. Since the return to pre-pandemic levels of passenger operations, we have seen the introduction of new, quieter aircraft types, such as the A320 Neo family and the Boeing 737-8200 (Max). The departure routes shown in the image below have been in operation since long before the pandemic. Arrivals equally follow similar patterns to pre-pandemic traffic. All aircraft movements are monitored against our published operational criteria to ensure continued compliance.
