


RETURNING TO OUR USUAL OPERATIONS

The number of aircraft operations in 2020 and 2021 was significantly affected by the pandemic with greatly reduced numbers of passenger movements but a continuation of cargo movements.

Now we have returned to pre-pandemic levels of passenger operations, we have seen the introduction of new, quieter aircraft types, such as the A320 Neo family and the Boeing 737-8200 (Max), and older noisier aircraft types being phased out, such as the McDonnell Douglas MD-11.

This move to quieter aircraft types has allowed us to reduce our departure noise limits for both night-time and daytime operations. In terms of 'normal 'operations, the arrival and departure routes aircraft fly now are identical to pre-pandemic operations. The noise preferential routes for departing aircraft are depicted below. All aircraft movements are monitored against our published operational criteria to ensure continued compliance. For more details visit Arrivals and Departure Maps.
