

HELP FOR OUR NEAREST NEIGHBOURS

We know having a busy international airport on your doorstep brings a wealth of employment and travel opportunities to the local community— but we acknowledge that there can be some downsides for our neighbours too.

People living directly under flight paths in the Wythenshawe, Heald Green, Mobberley and Knutsford areas are most affected by aircraft noise; and – on rare occasions – by vortices shed by descending aeroplanes causing damage to their roof.

Did you know that Manchester Airport provides funding to local residents to help minimise the impact of our operations on their daily lives? In the last decade, the Airport has provided more than £850,000 worth of funding to our neighbours via our Sound Insulation Grant and Vortex Repair Schemes. To find out more about which properties qualify for these grants and how to make a claim, please read our 'Mitigation Schemes'.



Good news!
Technological advances have enabled aircraft to become much quieter since we started our Sound Insulation Grant Scheme in 1972. Modern aeroplanes are 20-30 decibels quieter than early jet aircraft.

22 NEW GRANTS AWARDED TO LOCAL GOOD CAUSES

At the January meeting of the Community Trust Fund, our trustees committed £23,759 to 22 organisations from Stockport, Trafford, Manchester and Tameside, bringing our total to 72 projects supported in the financial year.

Among those awarded funds at the latest meeting were BLOOM Allotments project at the LEAP Children & Families Centre in Hyde. The group will receive £3,000 towards refurbishment of a woodshed, where the group holds community workshops. They were presented with a cheque by

Cllr Bill Fairfoull, a Community Trust Fund trustee, and Jonathan Reynolds MP, who visited for a tour of the project in February. In April we were pleased to support Friends of the Moor with £3000 towards a Trim Trail and the Indian Choir with £1950 towards Traditional Indian Instruments in October.

OVER 80 TRAINEES LAND THEIR DREAM AVIATION ROLE!

The Airport Academy at Manchester Airport supports local residents into careers and roles at Manchester Airport. The free two-week training course supports unemployed adults with meaningful skills to secure a role on-site.

Training includes developing an understanding of the Aviation industry and developing both employability and customer service skills to 'land that dream aviation role'; alongside a guaranteed interview. The Airport Academy offers free 'step into Aviation taster sessions' each fortnight for those who want to 'taste' over one day what the Academy can offer.

In 2022 over 140 adults were trained and over 80 secured roles within Manchester Airport. The Airport Academy are working with many employers now and have hundreds of roles available. Since November the Airport Academy team has committed to over 50 local and bespoke outreach events to support residents within Wythenshawe, Stockport, Trafford and central Manchester. In February the Airport Academy also delivered very successful Manchester Airport Jobs fair at Elliot House, Deansgate which was attended by over 500 jobs seekers and 30 on-site employers.

NEW PARTNERSHIP TAKES US CLOSER TO JET ZERO

Here at Manchester Airport, we're committed to securing a net zero-carbon future for the aviation industry. In an exciting step forward, we were delighted to partner with HyNet, one of the UK's leading Government-backed industrial decarbonisation projects, at the end of last year.

The partnership aims to explore how Manchester could become the first UK airport with a direct supply of hydrogen fuel. HyNet is a major infrastructure project that will build a pipeline to capture (and safely store) carbon dioxide from industrial emitters across the north west region; and supply them with much cleaner hydrogen to fuel their operations, as an alternative to natural gas. Connecting to the pipeline will enable Manchester Airport to offer hydrogen fuel to our 60+ airlines when the next generation of hydrogen-fuelled aircraft come into operation – currently expected to be in the mid-2030s. We're looking forward to a greener, more sustainable future for aviation – and for our local community!



MAN-TP BRINGS NEW COMMITMENT TO SOCIAL VALUE

You may have seen that in January, Manchester Airport announced phase two of its £1.3 billion transformation programme, the largest investment ever made at Manchester Airport.

Manchester's transformation programme started in 2017 and has already seen Terminal 2 more than double in size. The second phase will complete the transformation of Terminal 2, delivering a modern, state-of-the-art passenger experience throughout, and introducing an even greater array of shops, restaurants, and other facilities for those travelling through it.

On the airfield, work will be carried out to greatly improve the efficiency and flexibility of operations, unlocking more flights to a wide range of destinations around the world. Because the Airport is committed to a sustainable future and providing benefits to our communities whilst minimising our impact on the environment; A key element of the Transformation Programme is leaving a lasting legacy and ensuring that people and businesses from the region benefit from the development.

During the construction phase MAN-TP delivery partner Mace, and its supply chain partners will engage 1,500 young people across Greater Manchester, aim to raise £70,000 for local charities and donate 500 hours of employee volunteering time. More than 500 jobs will be created in the construction phase alone with at least 5% of the workforce being apprentices.
