Relaunch success for Stansted Employment and Skills Academy



The Stansted Employment & Skills Academy is a one-stop shop for anyone interested in on-site vacancies. It also offers aviation training programmes and apprenticeship schemes to enable job-seekers to gain relevant skills and secure employment at the airport.

Last year, we made the decision to in-source and relaunch the Academy, focusing on increasing the quality and quantity of training on offer. In-sourcing, along with working with over 200 on-site companies means the Academy's first year has been a roaring success. We have seen a 145% increase in those being trained by the Academy subsequently being placed into employment and a 73% increase in those being employed on-site.

We want to ensure all local people have access to employment opportunities at our airport, so we were particularly proud to launch our first free five-day Aviation Services Couse. Out of the 215 people trained this year on the course, we are delighted that over 100 already have found employment with us.

Case Study: "I cannot recommend the course enough. I normally find this sort of thing boring, but the course tutor was totally engaging and I found it really interesting. The course gave me the confidence to apply for positions that I wouldn't normally have gone for and the CV help/advice was invaluable. I have now been offered my dream job, which I didn't think I had a chance of getting before."

Stansted Airport's first multi-storey car park opens for business

London Stansted has officially opened its first multi-storey car park, located within a short walking distance of the terminal and boosting the number of short-stay car parking spaces available at the airport to more than 7,000.

The 2,700 space, six-storey car park forms part of the latest phase of the London Stansted Transformation Project, which will enable the airport to provide greater choice and better service for our passengers.

New check-in area opens as part of ongoing transformation project



Passengers using the airport over the summer have been benefitting from a new and improved check in area thanks to the completion of the latest terminal upgrade.

Eight new check-in desks opened at 5am on 11th July, taking the number of new desks opened as part of Stansted Airport's transformation project to 20.

"This is a really exciting time for London Stansted and our passengers, and this is just one example of the many planned developments in the terminal building which will help transform and improve the experience for the millions of passengers travelling through the airport each year."

To highlight our year-round environmental work, in March this year we handed out over 3,000 silver birch saplings to every school and parish within a 10 mile radius.

It was lovely to see over 70 schools get involved and our largest donation, 600 saplings, went to a local farm near Broxted, who used the trees to transform a neglected meadow into a forest!

Over 250 trees were planted at the airport itself, while staff were given

'beebombs' to create wildflower habitats in their gardens and also encouraged to plant a tree at home and sign a pledge to look after it for two years. The initiative flagged all the environment team's recent efforts, from recycling drives and environmental protection.

Part of the airport's sustainable growth last year was to build a new habitat creation area made up of ponds and green spaces.

"The aim of Biodiversity Week is to highlight all the good work the business is doing to maintain and improve our biodiversity across the airport site. We have made a commitment to be zero net loss to biodiversity, so initiatives like this help to ensure we not only achieve this, but that the airport grows in a sustainable way."

Stansted's environmental credentials

- From 2016/17 Stansted Airport's operation became carbon neutral
- Stansted Airport sends 0% of waste to land fill and 75% of all waste is recycled
- 100% of electricity from renewable sources since Stansted was acquired by MAG
- Stansted has a higher proportion (53%) of passengers using public transport percentage than any other UK airport. Everyone
- working at Stansted gets an 80% reduction in the cost of public transport with 33% of staff using public transport for work journeys.

 ISO14001 accredited and the first UK airport to meet the energy management standard ISO50001
- Surrendered items such as food, toiletries and toys which can't be taken through security are sent to local foodbanks
