MORE THAN 1500 LOCAL STUDENTS VISIT OUR BRAND NEW AEROZONE

Manchester Airport have unveiled a state-of-the-art education centre aimed at inspiring future generations about a career in aviation.

Greater Manchester's Mayor, Andy Burnham, was on hand to mark the opening of AeroZone, which was delivered as part of the Airport's £1bn transformation programme. He was joined by 15 pupils from Outwood Primary School in Heald

Green, who were treated to a tour of the new facility.

Since opening, 1,584 young people from across the region have enjoyed visits to our new facility. AeroZone is free of charge for all schools and colleges.

OVER 600 NEW STARTERS JOIN US FOR EXCITING CAREER OPPORTUNITIES AT THE AIRPORT

We've attended 53 recruitment events this year and signposted 1500 people to roles at MAG, with over 600 new starters joining this year already.

Since January 2022, our on-site Airport Academy, run in Partnership with Trafford College, has engaged with over 30 on-site employers, promoted the training programmes and on-site vacancies to 150 Jobs Centre Plus work coaches and supported over 2500 adults in and around Manchester.



BRINGING TECHNOLOGY TO LIFE FOR ST PAUL'S STUDENTS

This summer, our MAG Technology team hosted two 'Tech to Terminal' sessions at AeroZone. Students studying Computing at St Pauls High School enjoyed a variety of interactive lessons led by Airport experts.

WORKING TOGETHER TO MANAGE AIRCRAFT NOISE

The Flight Evaluation Unit (FEU) is a team of technical experts who review the aircraft noise and operational performance across all three MAG airports (Manchester, East Midlands, and Stansted). Within the team we analyse and report

- the noise monitored in our local communities
- the track keeping performance of our operating airlines
- the use of Continuous Descent Approaches or Continuous Climb Operations by aircraft

The FEU also investigates and responds to all community complaints regarding aircraft noise. This monitoring and reporting helps us to be the best neighbour we can to our local communities, and we use it to feedback to our Airline operators, and communicate with local community representatives.

At Manchester Airport, we are aware of the effect aircraft noise can have on those living around the airport and under flight paths and work hard to manage, monitor and reduce noise levels wherever possible.
